SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF THE JULY 8, 2025 REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING

The following is a summary of City Council action from the regular meeting held on July 8, 2025.

CONSENT CALENDAR

1. Resignation of Architectural and Preservation Commissioner Juan Cervera
Unanimously voted to accept with regret the resignation of Juan Cervera from the Architectural and Preservation Commission effective immediately. (AYES – 5, NOES – 0)
2. Adoption of a Resolution Approving the City Warrant Register
Unanimously voted to adopt a resolution approving the City warrant register dated July 3, 2025. (AYES – 5, NOES – 0)
3. City Council Minutes of June 24, 2025 (Regular)
Voted to approve the regular City Council meeting minutes of June 24, 2025. (AYES – 4, NOES – 0, ABSTENTIONS – 1, Councilmember Medina abstained from the item as he was absent from the June 24, 2025 City Council meeting)
4. Adoption of a Resolution Establishing the 2025-26 General Obligation Tax Rate for the Levy of an Ad Valorem Tax to be Collected to Make Debt Service Payments on Outstanding General Obligation Bonds Issued to Finance the Acquisition of Johnson's Pasture
Unanimously voted to adopt a resolution requesting and authorizing the County of Los Angeles to levy a tax on all real property in the City of Claremont as a voter approved levy with respect to the City's General Obligation Bond approved by the voters at the November 7, 2006 Statewide General Election to fund the acquisition of Johnson's Pasture. (AYES – 5, NOES – 0)
5. Adoption of a Resolution Authorizing Submittal of the Fiscal Year 2024-25 Transportation Development Act – Article 4; State Transit Assistance; Senate Bill 1 State Transit Assistance; and Senate Bill 1 State of Good Repair Claim Forms to Receive and Reserve Transit Funds for the Claremont Dial-A-Ride Service (Funding Source: Transportation Fund)
Unanimously voted to adopt a resolution authorizing the submittal of the 2024-25 Transportation Development Act – Article 4, State Transit Assistance, Senate Bill 1 State Transit Assistance, and Senate Bill 1 State of Good Repair claim forms to receive capital and operating funds. (AYES – 5, NOES – 0)

PUBLIC HEARING

6. Appeal of Architectural and Preservation Commission Approval of Architectural and Site Plan Review #25-A03 for a 63-Foot Tall Monoeucalyptus Wireless Telecommunications Facility for Eukon Group, LLC on Behalf of AT&T Located at 1700 North Towne Avenue – Appellant: James Quinn
Unanimously voted to adopt a resolution granting the appeal of and reversing the Architectural and Preservation Commission's approval of Architectural Site Plan Review #25-A03. (AYES – 5, NOES – 0)
